Catechesis Notes for the Week — "The End of Faith" The Apostles' Creed speaks concerning our ultimate hope! The hope of the Christian faith isn't to go to heaven when we die. The ultimate hope is the promise of Christ that we rise again with Him on the Last Day to spend eternity in the new heavens and the new earth. Scripture teaches us that when Christ returns He will raise all the dead. For those who believed in Him our souls will be united with our resurrected and glorified bodies. Those who rejected him will be resurrected as well, but separated from Christ in eternal death. Those who belong to Christ will receive the renewed earth as their inheritance. We will rule with Christ over creation as we were originally given to do. This new creation will be very familiar and entirely other. There will be no sin or corruption, no pain or suffering, no death. We will not have to eat by the sweat of our brow. God Himself will be with us in a way we've never experienced before. We can't even begin to imagine what it will be like.

The Order of Meditation and Prayer

Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate.

Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

Looking Forward to "Twenty-third Sunday after Pentecost"

Readings: Malachi 4:1-6 | 2 Thessalonians 3:(1-5) 6-13 | Luke 21:5-28 (29-36)

There are signs of the Lord's coming all around: the cross that marks His Church, the violence and death of the sinful world, and the shaking of the natural order. "There will be great distress upon the earth" (Luke 21:23), but the faithful know that "the kingdom of God is near" (Luke 21:31). Therefore, "straighten up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near" (Luke 21:28). Be awake and alert, and heed the words of Christ, which "will not pass away" (Luke 21:33). For you, "the sun of righteousness shall rise with healing in its wings" (Mal. 4:2). He sends His preachers of repentance in the spirit and power of Elijah "before the great and awesome day of the LORD comes" (Mal. 4:5), in order to "direct your hearts to the love of God and to the steadfastness of Christ" (2 Thess. 3:5). Although you are often faithless, "the Lord is faithful," and by the preaching of His Word "he will establish you and guard you against the evil one" (2 Thess. 3:3). Therefore, "do not grow weary in doing good" (2 Thess. 3:13). In the midst of calamity, believe upon the Lord, Jesus Christ.
