

# For the week of the Second Sunday after the Epiphany January 15<sup>th</sup>, through January 21<sup>st</sup>, 2022

Catechesis Notes for the Week — "In The Stead and By the Command" Every week during absolution I say I do this "in the stead and by the command" of Jesus, but what all does that mean? Well, it means I am not free to do or say as I please as a pastor. I do what I do on behalf of Jesus. He has commanded me what to say and what to not say. Specifically, He has commanded me that if anyone is repentant of their sin then I MUST deliver God's forgiveness to them. This is called the "loosing key" that pastors are to exercise. You may have confidence that when I deliver God's forgiveness to you that what is spoken on earth is spoken in heaven.

On the other hand, if someone has NOT repented it is my duty to speak God's Law to them and withhold forgiveness. This is called the "binding key" that pastors are to exercise. A pastor never eagerly makes use of this key. Before this key is used, a pastor does what He can. He proclaims God's Law so that people may turn from their sin and back toward God. However, when it has become clear that a person refuses to turn from their sin then a pastor has no choice but to use this binding key.

If talking to the person fails, a pastor moves to the minor ban where he refuses to give them the Lord's Supper. In theory, this ban is recognized at all altars of the Lord. Our modern context complicates this as our sinful nature doesn't want to offend or recognize the truth of Christ in the Lord's Supper. However, it is still our prayer that if someone would be placed under the minor ban it would be enough for them to examine themselves and repent.

If the person continues unrepentant, the next step is excommunication. It is a pastor's duty, along with the congregation, to inform the person they are outside of God's grace. This is not a matter of opinion, but what Christ has commanded. Excommunication only outwardly expresses the spiritual reality. This is not "kicking them out of the church," but acknowledging they have already walked out themselves, removing themselves from God's grace. It is not unloving or unkind. The desire is they realize the seriousness of their sin and turn.

May the Lord protect us from this and allow the loosing key to be the only one needed among us!

# CATECHISM — Confession and Office of the Keys

What is the Office of the Keys?	First Grade+
The Office of the Keys is that special authority which Christ has given to His church on earth to forgive the sins of repentant sinners, but to withhold forgiveness from the unrepentant as long as they do not repent.	
Where Is This Written?	Second Grade +
This is what St. John the Evangelist writes in chapter twenty: <b>The Lord Jesus breathed</b> on His disciples and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven."	
What do you believe according to these words?	Third Grade +
I believe that when the called ministers of Christ deal with us by His divine command, in particular when they exclude openly unrepentant sinners from the Christian congregation and absolve those who repent of their sins and want to do better, this is just as valid and certain, even in heaven, as if Christ our dear Lord dealt with us Himself.

Readings: Isaiah 9:1-4 | 1 Corinthians 1:10-18 | Matthew 4:12-25

By His coming in the flesh and by His preaching and miracles, the Lord Jesus shines the light of His Gospel upon "the people who walked in darkness" and "who dwelt in a land of deep darkness" (Is. 9:2). He also has "multiplied the nation" and "increased its joy" (Is. 9:3) by calling disciples to Himself from the ends of the earth. For this purpose, He calls Peter and Andrew, with James and John, to follow Him and be "fishers of men" (Matt. 4:19). As Jesus did, they also go forth "proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction among the people" (Matt. 4:23). They preach the foolishness of the cross of Christ as the very power and wisdom of God. This word and preaching of the cross divides "those who are perishing" from "us who are being saved" (1 Cor. 1:18), but it unites the Church, the one Body of Christ, "in the same mind and the same judgment" (1 Cor. 1:10).
