Catechesis Notes for the Week — "You can Lead a Horse to Water" A pastor is called by God to faithfully proclaim God's Word. "He must hold firmly to the trustworthy message as it has been taught, so that he can encourage others by sound doctrine and refute those who oppose it, " (Titus 1:9). A faithful pastor works hard to teach you God's Word though preaching, classes, pastoral care, and even in informal interactions. However, no matter how hard a pastor works, all his effort won't do much good if you aren't willing to listen. Yet how hard is it for us to listen to and submit to what others say? How much harder is it for our sinful flesh to listen to and submit to what Christ says?

That is why God is Scripture commands us to hold those who teach the Word of God in high regard. A faithful pastor doesn't wielding authority to hold it over you. He gains no personal benefit from you listening to Him, other than what is gained by all the saints through the joy of living together in the unity of Spirit and the bond of peace. A faithful pastor's desire is to help you know Christ even more, but often that requires pointing out what is hindering that knowledge. And so Luther highlights that those who hear the Word proclaimed by a faithful pastor should submit to the word that he proclaims.

To reiterate, this is not a submission of someone inferior to someone superior. All pastors are brothers among the saints. All pastors are also sinful humans and need correction themselves. So if you have a question or concern about something a pastor says, don't hesitate to ask questions! This is not a lack of submission, but rather is a loving act of care and service for your pastor. Dwelling in unity with the saints doesn't mean that there is no conflict, but it means pursuing truth together and trusting that Christ is stronger than any conflict we might encounter. So let us work together to hear and submit to the Word of God!

The Order of Meditation and Prayer

Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate.

Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

Looking Forward to "Second Sunday in Lent"

March 5, 2023

Readings: Genesis 12:1-9 | Romans 4:1-8, 13-17 | John 3:1-17

The Lord called Abram (Abraham) to leave his home and go to a land that God would show him. He also promised to make of Abram "a great nation," to bless him and make his name great as a blessing to "all the families of the earth" (Gen. 12:2–3). "Abram went, as the LORD had told him" (Gen. 12:4), and in Canaan "he built an altar to the LORD and called upon the name of the LORD" (Gen. 12:8). He "believed God, and it was counted to him as righteousness" (Rom. 4:3). Here the grace of God is manifested, that He "justifies the ungodly" (Rom. 4:5), not by works of the Law, but through faith in His promises. He removes all of our sins and lawless deeds through Jesus Christ, the offspring of Abraham in whom all the Lord's promises are realized. This forgiveness of sins is the Word of the Gospel, the voice of the Holy Spirit, which "gives life to the dead" (Rom. 4:17). It opens the eyes of faith to behold Christ Jesus, the Son of Man lifted up on the cross, "that whoever believes in him may have eternal life" (John 3:14–15).
