

# For the week of The Fourth Sunday of Easter April 30th, through May 7th, 2023

Catechesis Notes for the Week — "Lutheran Confessions" You may have heard of the Book of Concord, it and even know it contains the fundamental doctrines of Lutheranism. But how well do you know what it actually says? Since we have wrapped up with the Small Catechism (itself a document in the Book of Concord), we will be touching on parts of the Book of Concord (BoC) from now until the end of summer.

The primary document in the BoC is the Augsburg Confession (AC). The AC was written by the Lutheran Reformers to give answer to their faith. They were supposed to repent before Emperor Charles V but instead wrote this confession to argue that what they held was in accord with Scripture and the ancient Church.

This week we are highlighting the first four articles. <u>Article I</u> is about God. It affirms the Council of Nicaea in confessing God as Triune, three divine persons in one divine essence: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It concludes by condemning the ancient heresies that distorted or denied the doctrine of the Trinity.

<u>Article II</u> is about original sin. It affirms that since the fall of Adam, all who are naturally born are born with win, that is, without fear of God, without trust in God, and with an inclination to sin, called concupiscence. It continues on to say that this fallen condition alone condemns us to hell if we are not born anew through the Holy Spirit. It concludes by condemning ancient heresy that says that humanity is by nature good and not corrupt.

<u>Article III</u> is about Jesus. It affirms that Jesus, the eternal Word and Son of God, assumed human nature in Mary's womb. Thus, Jesus has two natures—divine and human—inseparably joined in one person. It continues to affirm what the Apostles' Creed confesses about Jesus as God and man.

<u>Article IV</u> is about justification. "Our churches teach that people cannot be justified before God by their own strengths, merits, or works. People are freely justified for Christ's sake, through faith, when they believe that they are received into favor and that their sins are forgiven for Christ's sake. By His death, Christ made satisfaction for our sins. God counts this faith for righteousness in His sight."

## The Order of Meditation and Prayer

Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate.

Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

# Looking Forward to "Fifth Sunday of Easter

May 7, 2023

The risen Lord Jesus alone is "the way, and the truth, and the life," and we come "to the Father" only through Him (John 14:6). God is thus "glorified in the Son," and those who believe in Him will do the works of Christ because He goes to the Father for us (John 14:12-14). Stephen, "a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit" (Acts 6:5) and "doing great wonders and signs among the people" (Acts 6:8), did the works of Christ. When he was falsely accused and put to death, he "gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God" (Acts 7:55). Fixing his hope there, he commended his spirit to the Lord Jesus and prayed for his murderers. In the same way, all the baptized are called to follow the example of Christ Jesus by faith. Though He was "rejected by men" in the sight of God, He is "chosen and precious" (1 Peter 2:4). He is the chief cornerstone of the Father's "spiritual house," and we are built upon Him as "living stones" (1 Peter 2:5).
