

# For the week of The Fifth Sunday of Easter May 7<sup>th</sup>, through May 13<sup>th</sup>, 2023

Catechesis Notes for the Week — "Lutheran Confessions" The next four articles largely talk about what this justification (Article IV) that Christ accomplished for us does to us when it embraces us.

Article V: The Ministry "So that we may obtain this [justifying] faith, the ministry of teaching the Gospel and administrating the Sacraments was instituted. Through the Word and Sacraments, as through instruments, the Holy Spirit is given." These are the means that Christ has given the Church, and so we trust God to work through these means. We are often tempted to believe that the Word and Sacraments are insufficient. When we do so, however, we are saying that we know better than God Himself how to convert people to the faith. That is why this article concludes by condemning those who believe that it is "through their own preparations and works the Holy Spirit comes to them without the external Word."

<u>Article VI: New Obedience</u> "Our churches teach that this faith is bound to bring forth good fruit. It is necessary to do good works commanded by God, because of God's will. We should not rely on those works to merit justification before God. The forgiveness of sins and justification is received through faith." God overflows our bucket with grace, and that overflow is good works. In other words, as ones who are saved we will perform good works. That's the nature of who we are as new creations in Christ.

<u>Article VII: The Church</u> "Our churches teach that one holy Church is to remain forever. The Church is the congregation of saints in which the Gospel is purely taught and the sacraments are correctly administered. It is not necessary that human traditions, that is, rites or ceremonies instituted by men, should be the same everywhere." It is Christ who makes the Church, and He does so through His Word and Sacrament. We do not make the Church through our own actions or conformity to any human rite.

<u>Article VIII: What the Church Is</u> Strictly speaking, the Church is the congregation of saints and true believers." The article goes on to recognize that there are many unbelievers within the midst of the Church, even in the clergy. It reaffirms that the Church is made my Christ, not by human efforts, so even if a secretly unbelieving clergy performs the Sacraments we can be assured that the validity and effectiveness of the Sacrament remains.

#### The Order of Meditation and Prayer

Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate.

Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

## Looking Forward to "Sixth Sunday of Easter

May 14, 2023

"The God who ... gives to all mankind life and breath and everything" (Acts 17:24–25) wants all people to seek Him that they might "feel their way toward him and find him" (Acts 17:27). But in our sinful ignorance, we humans turn instead to idols "formed by the art and imagination of man" (Acts 17:29). Therefore, God appointed the Man of Righteousness, Jesus Christ, and "has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead" (Acts 17:31). Because He lives, we also live (John 14:19) in His forgiveness, and thus we love Him and keep His commandments (John 14:15). While the risen Lord prepares us for His ascension, He will not leave us "as orphans" (John 14:18), but He gives "another Helper," the Holy Spirit, to be with us forever (John 14:16) through the preaching of "Jesus and the resurrection" (Acts 17:18). Because He "suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous" (1 Peter 3:18), we "honor Christ the Lord as holy" and are always "prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks" for the reason for our hope (1 Peter 3:15). Our Baptism "now saves" us "as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ" (1 Peter 3:21).
